Tell us a little of your early life and conversion?

I was born in Belfast to Christian parents and heard the gospel from my earliest days. My parents were involved in the work of a local mission hall, but I followed my two older brothers into the



Salvation Army. There, under the ministry of a team of American evangelists, I received Christ as my Saviour. We moved house soon after that; and, when the Free Church planted a congregation in Mt. Merrion Avenue, Belfast, my mother brought my younger brother and me along to the services. That became my spiritual home and the place where I first became engaged in Christian service. During teenage years, I was plagued with many doubts, but in a memorable late night prayer meeting the Lord settled them and gave me assurance. I had the privilege of sitting under the ministry of Rev. S. B. Cooke, and it was as he preached that the Lord called me into the work of the Free Presbyterian ministry.

What is your favourite Bible verse?

That is difficult to say, because different passages have been used by the Lord at different stages in my life. John 6:37 is precious as the text He used to lead me to complete assurance. Psalm 90:16, 17 were used to call me into the ministry. Psalm 65:11 was a promise the Lord sealed to my heart at a particularly difficult time and that He fulfilled in letting me experience a very fruitful time of soul-winning. So it's hard to pick out one verse or passage, though I must say that the prayers of Paul in Ephesians 1:15-23 and 3:14-21 have lived constantly in my heart and mind for many years.

What is your favourite hymn?

Again, there are so many. For years in Greenville I had the joy of having a wonderful singing congregation. Great God of Wonders, O, for a Thousand Tongues, All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name, and Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven all bring back many thrilling memories. And then there is Jesus, Thy Blood and Righteousness, a truly wonderful hymn.

What do you see as the greatest challenge for the church in the 21st century?

The challenge to the church has always been the same, to "know Christ and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death." To be in the world, but not of it; to deny self and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit; to be faithful to Christ and to live in the fulness of His Spirit—this is our calling, from which the world, the flesh, and the devil will do all they can to distract us. People think our challenge is to make the gospel "relevant" to this generation. Not at all. Salvation is a supernatural work of God. What we need is to know God and the power of His Spirit and He will make His word effective.

What is your vision for the future of the church?

I pray that the Free Church will cherish our unity in the faith once delivered to the saints, that it will stand fast in Biblical separation without descending into needless divisiveness, and that it will again know the power of prayer to prevail with God and the power of His Spirit to prevail with men through the preaching of the gospel.

As a new venture this year, we will also be taking a marquee to the Highland Games in Glenarm on Monday 14th July. The event organisers were very willing to allow us to attend this event.



Saved By Grace

Testimony of James McAllister

When I look back at the early part of my life. I can remember some very happy times, but also some very sad. The saddest time of all was when I was just 15 years of age and my mother died; this was a huge blow to me. It was at that time that I started to taste of the things of this world,

particularly alcohol.

I was married at the young age of eighteen, and my wife Dorothy and I had children; but I must confess that I wasn't a very good husband or father. My main interests were attending football matches and plaving in a flute band. Sadly, they gave me further opportunities to indulge in more alcohol.

In 1984, I started to have pain in my back and went to the doctor. He arranged for me to have an X ray which revealed I had an infection in my liver. The doctor informed me that it was one of two things causing an infection - either jaundice or the alcohol I had been drinking. He advised me to stay off alcohol for six months to see if there would be any improvement; and although wondered how I would get through Christmas, I decided to give it a go.

It was during October 1984 that I started to come under conviction of sin and started to think about the things of God and eternal matters. I didn't know at the time what was happening to me; it was only later that I realised that it was the work of the Holy Spirit in my

> soul. During period, I asked my sister Sylvia, who was a saved girl, if knew she οf anywhere I could go to hear the Word of God. She showed me from our local newspaper church notices that there was a week of meetings Coleraine Free Presbyterian Church, and converted а

Roman Catholic priest was giving his testimony on the Monday night.

I decided to go and hear him, and he told of how he had been converted to Christ and had been persecuted because he had left the priesthood and the church. It was one remark he

made which really struck me; he said that he didn't need to be saved merely because he was a Roman Catholic or a priest, but he needed to be saved because he was a sinner of Adam's fallen race. He went on to say that professing Protestants, outside of Christ, were also sinners who needed to be saved just like everyone else, quoting Romans 3 v 23 "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." He stressed that the sinner must come to Christ alone for salvation.

It was a few days after this, on 18th October 1984, that I came to an end of myself; and, in my own bedroom, I got down on my knees as a guilty Hell deserving sinner and called upon the name of the Lord. I thanked Him for paying the great price for my sin; and then, repenting of my sins, I received and rested upon Him as my own and personal Saviour. I received the promise from scripture: whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Rom 10 v

I thank God for all His grace and help over the years attending Coleraine , during my studies in the F.P.C. Whitefield College of the Bible, working under the Mission Board, and, in recent years, serving Him in Ballymena F.P.C.
