Praying for one Another

Covenant Church Newmilns

Newmilns is a small town in the Irvine valley, East Ayrshire. We have met in a local community hall (the Morton Hall) since the congregation was formed about five and a half years ago. We have a good mix of ages with a thriving creche, Sunday school and youth group. As well as morning and evening services on Sundays we have a midweek programme which alternates fortnightly between Prayer Meetings and Connect groups which meet in homes for fellowship, study and prayer.

Prayer Points

1. Coming up we have a Family Fun afternoon (20/4) and Quiz night (11/5). Please pray that they will be even more effective at seeing people from outside the church coming in than when we've run these events previously. Pray that they will hear and understand the gospel message and, in God's time, that many might come to faith in Him.

We are a congregation of all ages and are encouraged to have a number of weekly and monthly groups such as Women for Mission, a ladies prayer group, youth nights, youth Bible studies and after-church gatherings on a regular basis.
